5th June 2014 NHS PAY PROTEST DAY OF ACTIVITY

5th June 2014 has been designated as the first day of protesting in the NHS around the NHS pay campaign.

<u>Protesting days are not days of industrial action.</u> The idea of protesting and the activity generated from this should support GMB NHS workplaces to organise, communicate and motivate the membership and to inform the membership that their union is supporting them in their workplace. The key to a successful day of protesting will be down to individual workplaces. There are no rules on protesting, other than the need to make every effort to involve all the membership, as well as using it to recruit and consolidate GMB membership in the workplace.

5 June is an opportunity to raise the issue of pay within your workplace and to reinforce the link between fair pay and a quality workforce for the NHS. If you haven't already got an event/activity planned, here are some ideas:

Ideas for activities on 5 June for GMB NHS Pay Campaign

- GMB members can register to join the NHS pay campaign at nhs@gmb.org.uk and can complete a short survey which will be available soon.
- NHS workers work beyond their contracted hours and to demonstrate just how much the NHS relies on goodwill - use a totaliser/tally/sweets in a jar on a ward, dept, or ambulance station. Ask members to record how many hours of unpaid overtime they have done on that day/week. Publish and share the results.
- The use of social media can be a powerful way in reaching 1000's of people in seconds. The GMB NHS sector has now set up an official twitter account; tweeters can find us @GMBNHS - we will be doing coordinated days of tweeting via this account and we will send our first tweet on the 5/6 protest day. Our hash tags for the 5/6 will be #NHSpay #GMBfairpay It will be great to have a coordinated effort of tweeters tweeting @Jeremy_Hunt @DHgovuk
- We are asking the staff side to consider holding a lunchtime rally/ protest/flashmob or as someone recently suggested a silent 10 minute protest outside their workplace holding up a piece of paper saying I am protesting for fair pay because (see attached appendix 1) The idea is get someone to take a photo and then tweet your message email to nhs@gmb.org.uk or tweet @GMBNHS
- Hold a campaign stall in your workplace. Get members of the public involved by getting them to sign the GMB NHS pay petition (this will be available via the GMB website shortly).
- Organise an open meeting about NHS pay and the impact on staff and patients and invite your local MP to attend. Your GMB Regional Office can assist where needed.
- Write to your MP about the impact the NHS pay restraint could have. Model letters are available by emailing <u>nhs@gmb.org.uk</u>
- Having workplace meetings or a stall in the community. You could ask people to sign a petition or write a letter to their local MPs on behalf of NHS staff.
- Blogging offers an opportunity for front line NHS staff to talk about their experience. The GMB is keen to have plenty of personal stories from members about why they work for the NHS and their concerns for the future. Get in touch email a short personal story <u>nhs@gmb.org.uk</u> and we will convert these stories into blogs and publicise them for members on a section on the GMB website.

What you do

What you do on 5 June is up to you. All we ask is you generate as much activity around the NHS pay campaign. A GMB ballot will follow and we need to ensure all our members are aware of what is happening to their pay.

Please send a brief email to nhs@gmb.org.uk setting out what you are doing. A further newsletter will be issued setting out which workplaces are taking part, with a short description of activity to be shared across the GMB regions.
