AMBULANCE MEMBERS PAY CONSULTATION COMMENCES HAVE YOUR SAY!

STOP - READ - HAVE YOUR SAY

GMB Ambulance members were right to escalate industrial action. Many in the GMB were keen to take industrial action in December 2014. However, a decision was made that as the NHS was facing unprecedented demands on its services, escalation of industrial action would take place in January 2015. An initial 48 hour stoppage was announced by GMB in the Ambulance Service in December 2014. After much discussion including lobbying by some ambulance employers, GMB agreed the first escalation would consist of a 24 hour GMB stoppage and this was scheduled for 29th January 2015.

The action on the 29th January was suspended and talks started. It's fair to say, talks only started because of the ambulance strike escalation. These talks have resulted in a pay offer tabled by Government. Please note, the pay offer if accepted will be implemented from April 2015 only.

Details of the pay offer include:

- 1% consolidated pay increase for all staff up to pay point 42.
 Abolition of the bottom pay point (PP) of AfC and an increase of PP2 to £15,100 with a further consolidated pay rise of £200 or 2.1-2.3% for staff in PP3-8.
- Annex E sickness pay arrangements to be retained.
- Ambulance Employers to introduce a scheme whereby they will match the value of additional pension contributions made by front line ambulance staff to enable them to take their 2015 pension unreduced at 65. (please see page two for full details)

Senior GMB NHS and Ambulance representatives, together with the unions' senior officials have considered the new offer very carefully. It clearly does not meet all our aspirations, but it shows that our combined actions have forced the Government back to the negotiating table and secured improvements that otherwise would not have been forthcoming. This is the best outcome achievable by negotiation and to achieve more would require a much higher level of strike action throughout the NHS. Initial soundings show insufficient support for this. Therefore, weighing all these factors together, **GMB recommends the new offer is** accepted. The final decision will be made by GMB members.

NEXT STEPS

GMB is consulting you on the pay offer. Consultation is now open and will conclude on FRIDAY 27th FEBRUARY 2015.

All NHS Strike action has been suspended, subject to consultation outcome.

The result of the consultation will be announced as soon as the consultation concludes. GMB members are asked to encourage all non-union members to sign up to the GMB today. Attacks on NHS pay remain a threat, get signed up and join the GMB today.

DETAILS OF AMBULANCE EMPLOYER PROPOSAL INCLUDE

- 1) In relation to Sickness / Unsocial hours allowance (USH) payment; discussions have been curtailed for the move away from Annex E USH. Employers' have also agreed to curtail discussions around a move towards section 2a unsocial hours under A4C. Employers have agreed to suspend immediately any further work to test, in the High Court, the national agreement on sick pay which relates to the NHS Employers and the Ambulance view Employers that the agreements included the Ambulance Service Sector. This issue would now instead be remitted to the wider talks on further AfC reform. GMB will continue to defend terms and conditions of all ambulance staff.
- 2) Ambulance Employers to introduce a scheme whereby they will match the value of additional pension contributions made by front line ambulance staff to enable staff to take their 2015 pension unreduced at 65. For instance if the cost of this was 4%, the employer would pay 2%. This issue has remained an issue since changes were brought in as a result of the reform of the NHS pension scheme.
- 3) Ambulance employers have agreed to work with the ambulance unions to address current recruitment and retention issues, either through changes to use of job profiles and bandings or through application of recruitment and retention premia to job roles meeting agreed criteria. The GMB welcomes these talks and will fully engage in these talks.
- 4) Ambulance Employers will take forward with Ambulance Unions a specific work stream under the NHS Staff Council Working Longer Review identifying the specific challenges for front line ambulance staff of the increase in pension age and how they can be addressed. Again the GMB welcomes these talks and will fully engage in these talks.
